Category:ATI Technologies hardware Category:Graphics chips Category:Video cardsMANILA, Philippines – The public may soon be allowed to use internet cafes and other business establishments like hotels and restaurants as new mobile phone base stations, giving customers an option to access the internet in some parts of the country. The Department of Information and Communications Technology is currently in the process of finalizing rules for the use of such technology, said Department Spokesperson Col. Tom Acuña. "Let me explain to you the concept of this," Acuña said during the daily Cabinet meeting. "Say you're in a certain area in Manila where you cannot really get a signal. And if we can put a signal through to that area that you can connect to the internet, you can access the internet." "Those will be in hotels, or can be used in coffee shops, or any other establishment that has a Wi-Fi connection," he added. The ICT has already approved rules for the use of these mobile phone base stations and they will be issued soon. They will be dubbed as E-Cell Base Station (ECBS) licenses. It would also require the companies to secure an infrastructure license (IL) before they can actually start installing their base stations. "When a company is going to set up base station of that type, they will be allowed to use any infrastructure that is already operating, provided they give notice, acquire the necessary licenses and pay whatever fees are required of them," Acuña said. Business establishments that offer Wi-Fi connection would be required to pay a fee of P75,000 for their installation, he said. He said the ICT would notify all possible applicants, who will be further subjected to the Commission on Elections' qualifications. A permit will also be needed before one can apply to be a mobile phone base station operator. The mobile phone base station operators will be subject to a P3.5-million fee for every base station. Acuña said the ICT will also be making a proposal to the Commission on Information and Communication Technologies to allow internet cafes to use the country's cellular networks to provide internet access.

The European car giants have been asked by the Government to block the sale of new Peugeot and Citroën models as it emerges the two firms have come under pressure to fill a void left by declining UK sales. Peugeot and Citroën both blame the lack of sales on the UK's decision to leave the European Union. The two carmakers, which employ about 35,000 people in the UK, have urged ministers to intervene to ensure sales of the two brands do not collapse because the EU will not be able to offer the same type of support to British firms as it does now. Peugeot, which has had to seek a \$735 million loan from the French Government to keep it going, said it was unclear how long it would be able to continue operating with a market that has collapsed. European governments, which have committed about £2 billion to the French firm as part of the UK's membership of the EU, may not be able to offer the same support if Britain leaves the EU, which many expect to happen in the summer. The UK industry body, the British Vehicle Manufacturers Association, fears Britain's departure from the EU could result in "a wave of withdrawals" from the UK's automotive industry and in 2017 the number of new car registrations will fall by about 11,000 units on 2014. Earlier this month, the Government announced plans to help firms struggling to fill key sales roles. Minister for employment Caroline Dinenage said that firms which faced recruiting difficulties could be allowed to appoint more temporary staff. Business Secretary Vince Cable said at the time: "If we think of the automotive sector in the UK, there are more than 100,000 jobs in it, making it about 10 per cent of all UK jobs, and there's a huge amount of churn."
